**II. THE PERSON YOU'VE MET - B. JESUS CHRIST - 2. HIS DEATH**

Jesus of Nazareth died by crucifixion. That was the normal means of executing non-Roman citizens, and many other men of that time died that way too. Jesus did not die any more or any less than any other man, but there are some very significant aspects to His death.
